### PLENARY COUNCIL 2020

#### What is a Plenary Council? Why a Plenary Council? PART 3

Through this, Vatican II teaches, the Church is "infallible in believing". So, this "sense of the faithful" is a sacred conduit for finding out what God is asking of us in Australia at this present time. The bishops' role of "oversight" is to ensure that contemporary interpretations of divine revelation are faithful to the past. But, equally importantly, to ensure that God's present activity in human history is being attended to. This is done by attending and interpreting to the signs of the times and listening to the faithful.

This, then, is what we hope to tap into during the preparatory stage leading up to the Plenary Council. We will be having "open dialogue and listening sessions". Each person's perspective will be valued. No individual has an infallible sense of the faith. We only have a sense of what God is wanting by allowing as many as possible to have a voice in the conversation God wants to have with the church. Singly we see a special viewpoint; together we see much more. *to be continued...*
